Jacob Kaplan (Héctor Noguera) is a 76-year-

old retiree, living in Montevideo with his wife of 50 years, Rebecca (Nidia Telles), and the insatiable desire to do something meaningful with his life before it's too late. A survivor who escaped Poland during WWII, he immigrated to South America on his own, having lost his entire family during the Holocaust. After overhearing his granddaughter talking about a German café owner, whom all the kids call "the Nazi," and catching a news report about a war criminal caught in Argentina and sent back to Israel to face trial, he embarks on what he perceives to be his true calling: Nazi hunting. Together with his hapless chauffeur, Contreras (Néstor Guzzini), Mr. Kaplan targets the seafront restaurateur (Rolf Becker) as a former SS officer taking refuge in Uruguay. Of course, amidst their plans to take "the Nazi" hostage, the amateur investigators discover more than they bargained for, ultimately realizing the true purpose of their findings.

Evocative of '60s Italian cinema, MR. KAPLAN will delight audiences with its unique blend of comedy and drama, its sprightly soundtrack, Wes Anderson-esque cinematography, and sweet ensemble cast.

Considered one of the most influential Jewish writers of the twentieth century, Isaac Bashevis Singer (best known for Yentl the Yeshiva Boy and Gimpel The Fool) received the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1978 "for his impassioned narrative art which, with roots in a Polish-Jewish cultural tradition, brings universal human conditions to life.'

In Shaul Betser's and Asaf Galay's fascinating documentary, THE MUSES OF ISAAC BASHEVIS **SINGER**, we learn of Singer's most titillating of literary inspirations — his "harem full of translators." In the mid-1960s, the prolific author employed dozens of women to translate his signature Yiddish prose and spread his works to both English-speaking and international audiences. Through archival footage and the intimate in-depth recollections of nine of the 40 women who brought Singer's stories to life, this absorbing documentary sheds light on a previously unknown and eccentric chapter in the unlikely ladies' man and iconic author's life.

In Yari and Cary Wolinsky's awe-inspiring documentary **RAISE THE ROOF**, we witness the construction and the 2014 unveiling of the Gwozdziec roof, the centerpiece of POLIN Museum of the History of Polish Jews in Warsaw.

Neither Jewish nor Polish, artists and educators Rick and Laura Brown of Handshouse Studio embarked on a 10-year mission to reconstruct the Gwozdziec Synagogue, an 18th century Polish synagogue whose distinct architecture rivals the greatest wooden architecture in history. Leading more than 300 students and professionals from 16 countries, the Browns discover a lost world in the midst of grappling with how to accurately engineer the synagogue's elaborate roof and painted ceiling with the period tools and methods used by the original builders. By the end of their incredible journey, they achieve a feat even more remarkable than the restoration of a lost wooden synagogue. Collectively, their efforts have empowered a new generation of Poles to connect to their history and shape the Poland of tomorrow.
